What Families With College-Bound Students Need to Know This Spring

Perhaps even more nerve-wracking than waiting for your child's college acceptance letters is learning whether they've been awarded financial aid. Recent changes to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) designed to simplify the process have led to unforeseen hiccups and technical glitches, causing academic institutions to delay sending out financial aid award letters. However, once you finally get the results, it can give your

family a better idea of what to do next.

"Our research shows that for a majority of parents, figuring out how to pay for college was the 'road to college' activity that caused them the most stress. By making a financial plan and prioritizing it, you can be well prepared to avoid the most common bumps in the road," explains Angela Colatriano, chief marketing officer, College Ave.


Colatriano recommends using the spring to teach your child these valuable financial skills: how to set up a budget, how to pay bills and how to manage credit. If your family will potentially be borrowing to finance college, students should also gain an understanding of how loans work, and how the different terms of the loan will affect their monthly payments and overall loan cost.

Speaking of budget, you should set a realistic budget for yourself. A recent College Ave survey found that in addition to helping pay for tuition and housing costs, parents also contribute to their child's phone bill (65%), health insurance (61%), food and groceries (42%), cable and internet bill (35%) and transportation (32%). Be realistic about which expenses you can afford and where you want to ask your child to chip in.

Decode Award Letters

Financial aid award letters can look different for each school. Familiarize yourself with their components so that when they arrive, you'll be ready to decipher them. Here's what to look for:

1. Free money: The award letter will list



2. Federal Work-Study: Your child might be eligible for Federal Work-Study jobs. While jobs aren't guaranteed, they can be a good opportunity to help cover educational expenses.

3. Student Loans: Schools will list any federal loans your child is eligible to receive. Helpful hint: They may be grouped with scholarships and grants. You should also note whether the loan is subsidized or unsubsidized. Because unsubsidized loans accrue interest while your student is enrolled and during deferment periods, this will affect the overall loan cost.

4. Other factors: Check if awards being offered are for all four years and understand what your child will need to do to continue being eligible for them, year-to-year.

To get an apples-toapples look at the offers, calculate the net direct cost of each school by subtracting offered scholarships and grants from the cost of attendance (tuition, room, board, textbooks and fees). If applicable, you can subtract work-study aid too. You should also factor in expected increases in tuition, room, board and other fees.


Fill in the Gaps

If after doing the math, you find you have a financial gap to cover, look into private scholarships. One easy one to enter on a monthly basis is College Ave's \$1,000 Scholarship Monthly Sweepstakes.

You may also want to consider a private student loan or parent loan. Look for a lender with great rates, flexible repayment terms, and the opportunity to customize the loan to fit your budget. 

In the past three seasons, the Los Fresnos Falcons Baseball team has earned a reputation for being one of the top teams in the Rio Grande Valley. From reaching the 6A Region Four Finals in 2021, to back-to-back undefeated district championships in 2022 and 2023, The Falcons have certainly made a name for themselves. In 2024, the trend of dominance looks to be continuing so far as Los Fresnos sits at 3-0 to begin District 32-6A.

To open up district play, Los Fresnos took on Brownsville Rivera. Despite being 4-0 in their last four meetings against Brownsville Rivera, this has become quite the rivalry between the Raiders and Falcons. Last season, the Falcons and Raiders clashed in two close matchups, including a 10-inning game in last season's 32-6A opener. This season, the Falcons were once again able to defeat the Raiders with a 1-0 win after a scoreless game the majority of the night. In game two, the Falcons once again defeated Brownsville Rivera, this time in a high scoring game. A combined 12-run shootout saw Los Fresnos sweep the Raiders in the series with a 7-5 victory. Now on the slate were

the Weslaco Panthers. Arguably Los Fresnos' biggest rival in District, the Panthers and Falcons have been the top dogs of the district. In the 2022 regular season, the Falcons and Panthers were battling for the 32-6A crown, as both teams were unbeaten all season. The stars aligned perfectly as the Los Fresnos and Weslaco Series was the final series of the regular season in 2022. Ever since then, both teams have battled with Los Fresnos on the winning end of the last four meetings.

Los Fresnos took control early with a two run first inning and never looked back. The game would remain scoreless as defense was the theme of the matchup. The Falcons would eventually tack on a third run in the fourth before Weslaco would respond with their first and only run of the night in the fifth. Los Fresnos would pick up the win 7-5.

Los Fresnos will finish out the series with Weslaco before turning their attention to Brownsville Hanna and San Benito as they continue on their journey for a three-peat in District.







RIO GRANDE VALLEY, TEXAS – APRIL 2, 2024 – Briana Gonzalez DiGrazia knew she wanted to be in medicine from a young age. Looking back, she fondly remembers dinner conversations with her parents about their experiences in healthcare.

"My mom worked as a nurse, and my dad was a respiratory therapist, so the best part of dinner was listening to them talk about their day," said Gonzalez DiGrazia. "I saw how hard they worked to care for their patients, but I also saw how rewarding their job was."

Now in her second year as a UTRGV School of Medicine student, Gonzalez DiGrazia has received recognition for her exemplary dedication to healthcare. She earned the prestigious U.S. Public Health Service 2024 Excellence in Public Health Award, recognizing medical students who demonstrate leadership in advancing initiatives to enhance public health and address prevalent health issues within their communities.

The award is a national recognition given to medical students who have shown a commitment to public health and equity during their studies.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Growing up in McAllen in the Rio Grande Valley, where a large portion of the population is affected by diabetes and hypertension, Gonzalez DiGrazia saw firsthand just how a person's environment can affect their health. In the Valley, where a large portion of those affected remain uninsured, healthcare access and treatment options remain out of reach for many.

Determined to impact her community, Gonzalez DiGrazia worked to understand and bring solutions to these issues.

"I developed a research and interdisciplinary educational initiative with the Texas Medical Association and the Area Health Education (AHEC) Scholars Program," she said. "We worked to provide uninsured patients with hypertension with a free blood pressure cuff and education in the hopes of preventing future cardiovascular events like strokes."

A PERSONAL MISSION

These efforts were a personal mission for Gonzalez DiGrazia, whose family struggled with limited access to healthcare.

"My grandfather passed away suddenly from a stroke in his 40s, and at the time, my mom lived in a rural part of Mexico where the nearest hospital was hours away," she said. "My father and his family also worked in the fields as migrant workers after immigrating to the US, so going to the doctor wasn't always an option."

Being a Valley native and her family background profoundly influenced her medical journey.

Those factors gave her an understanding of the healthcare challenges faced by many in the region, fueling her determination to effect positive change in healthcare access in South Texas.

"We need to ensure our patients have access to primary care services so they can be aware of any health conditions and work with their providers to monitor these before it becomes an emergency," said Gonzalez DiGrazia. "This is something that the UTRGV School of Medicine has done through the AHEC clinics, and I'm grateful to be a part of that, even as a student."

FUTURE HEALTHCARE LEADERS

Dr. Maurice Clifton, senior associate dean of Student Affairs and Admissions at the UTRGV School of Medicine, said Gonzalez DiGrazia is a prime example of the future healthcare leaders being produced at the academic medical institution.

"Briana exemplifies the values of compassion, dedication, and excellence that we strive to instill in our students," he said. "Her commitment to addressing healthcare issues in our community is commendable, and we are immensely proud of her." Gonzalez DiGrazia

said she's proud to have received such a prestigious award and is grateful for the experience and support from the UTRGV School of Medicine.

"There was a time when I didn't think I would be able to attend medical school, especially since it's so competitive and was far from home," she said.

Despite this, she encourages other Valley students to pursue a medical career and utilize the resources now found at "home" through the UTRGV School of Medicine.

"I know how difficult the path to becoming a physician is, but I encourage other students from the Valley to stay persistent and keep working hard," she said. "Our patients need more physicians who understand them and can meet the specific needs of the Valley."

Expert Landscaping Tips for Choosing and Installing Plants

The perfect landscape may start with a healthy, lush lawn, but for interest and depth, you'll also need to consider the plants that surround it. Thankfully, it's easy to make considerable improvements to your backyard life using tips from professionals. Landscape designer Doug Scott has partnered with lawn care equipment manufacturer Exmark, to offer these tips for selecting and installing plants that will beautify your outdoor living areas.

Choosing Plants

• Choose plants wellsuited for your specific growing conditions. Knowing your growing zone is important, however you should also be mindful how conditions like sun exposure can change as you move around your

yard.

• Choose the right size plants for the space. Bear in mind that what you're planting today is much smaller than what it will be once it's matured. Always read a plant's care label to understand its optimal growing conditions and size at maturity.

• From a design perspective, think in terms of texture, layers and drifts. When addressing the overall texture of your planting beds, choose plants that vary in form, size, color and leaf structure. This will create greater interest, and a space that's more visually appealing and enjoyable to spend time in.

For a lush look, think in terms of layers when considering composition. Much like in a painting, you should have background, middle ground, and foreground

layers. Your background layer should consist of taller evergreen shrubs to provide something alive and green to look at all year long, no matter what's happening in front of them. Your middle ground layer should be lower than the background layer to create interest, and is where you can add a contrasting evergreen shrub or pop of color with a perennial plant. Finally, your foreground layer should help transition the planting beds to your lawn space. You can accomplish this with smaller perennials, evergreens, annuals or creeping ground covers.

When addressing drifts, read the plant labels to know how large they'll grow. This can help ensure plants grow in together as they mature, but are not overcrowded.

Installing Them



1. Dig a hole that's about two times the diameter of the pot your plant's being transplanted form, and about the depth of the pot.

2. Mend in compost or soil conditioner to give your plant the organic material it needs to thrive. If you'd like, add slowrelease fertilizer, and mix well.

3. Place your plant in the hole, making sure that it sits at, or just above, the level it did in the pot.

4. Backfill with soil,

stopping to add water when the hole is about halfway full.

5. Fill the rest of the hole with soil, then firmly press down.

6. Soak your plant with more water.

7. Finish by adding mulch, making sure it's pulled away from the base of your plant.
